Cookies

Oxeon's website contains cookies. A cookie is a small text file, which is stored by the website on the visitor's computer. Cookies are used by many websites in order to e.g. give the visitor access to various functions. The information contained in the cookie makes it possible to monitor a user's surfing. There are two types of cookies: temporary and permanent cookies. Temporary cookies are stored temporarily in the memory of your computer and are erased when you close your web browser. Permanent cookies are stored for a longer time period on your computer. Oxeon uses temporary cookies only.

Information we collect and how we use it

Oxeon uses the Google Analytics tool in order to obtain information about who is visiting our website, what you are looking for, how our website is used, how you are getting to our website etc., which can be used to e.g. improve the contents, navigation and structure of our website. The information which is generated by the use of this tool will be forwarded to Google and stored of Google at servers located in the USA. Google may transfer this information to third parties if this is required by applicable law or in case a third party handles the information on behalf of Google. More information about this tool can be found at <http://www.google.com/analytics/>. No other cookies from third parties are used by Oxeon.

When you access Oxeon's website, servers used by us automatically record information such as your web request, browser type, browser language, date and time etc. Oxeon also calculates the number of users and traffic. By understanding how our website is used, we can use this information in order to develop and improve our website so that functionality increases.

Oxeon uses statistics in collected or aggregated format about users, traffic and internet service providers. Such statistics however, never contain any kind of personal information such as e.g. names, e-mail addresses or any other information which can be connected to a particular person.

Databases accessible to us, which store behavior on our website, do not include any IP addresses. Therefore, information about website behavior can never be linked to your personal identity.

Oxeon does not share information gained by the use of cookies with anyone, except to the extent this is required by our use of Google Analytics.

How to avoid cookies

Most web browsers are initially set up to accept cookies, but you can change the settings in your browser in order to disable or prompt cookies. If you are using Internet Explorer, use the Tools menu, choose Internet Options, Privacy and then Advanced Privacy Settings, where you can check a box for either blocking or prompting cookies from both first parties and third parties. If you are using Mozilla Firefox, use the Tools menu, choose Privacy, and then "Firefox will use custom settings for history", after which you can uncheck the boxes "Accept cookies from sites" and "Accept third-party cookies". If you are using any other web browser and wish to find out how to disable or prompt cookies, or if you wish to delete previously stored cookies, please use the help section for your web browser in order to find out how.

If you choose not to accept cookies, this may impact the functionality of our website.
